The Developmental Therapist Certificate is applicable for those individuals who work with infants and toddlers with disabilities, ages birth through 2 years, who are receiving services in the First Connection Early Intervention Program. The Teachers College, Henderson State University Program of Study consists of 15 hours of graduate-level course work, including a three-hour practicum in an early intervention program.
