

Required Number of Hours: 18

Description of certificate: (Include an introductory paragraph and certificate plan of study.) This 18 hour graduate certificate gives students who hold graduate degrees in fields other than History the opportunity to earn 18 hours in History that is required by the Higher Learning Commission to be qualified to teach a concurrent enrollment course at a high school, two year college or four year university. The 18 hours may also be applied towards the completion of the Master of Liberal Arts degree at Henderson State University.
