Those required to take College Algebra must complete Intern. Algebra.</p> <p>Remedial hrs. DO NOT count toward graduation.</p> <p>Students may count no more than 7 hours of "D" in the Liberal Arts Core. Students must earn grades of "C" or better in Freshman English A & B.</p> <p>Grades of "C" or better are also required in courses used to meet the Writing Across The Curriculum requirements.</p> <p>Students must earn a min. of 42 junior/senior hours in order to graduate. Most of these courses will be taken in the student's chosen major, however, any upper level course approved in the Liberal Arts Core will also count towards this requirement. Foreign language at the intermediate level may count as upper level if taken during the junior or senior year.</p> <p>Students with a score of 25 or higher on the English and Reading sections of the ACT (or equivalent test) will be awarded credit for ENG 1463 (Freshman English A) after completion of 15 hours at Henderson with a 2.00 or higher grade point average and ENG 1473 (Freshman English B) with a grade of "C" or better.</p>
