Arkansas requires students with ACT scores below 19 in Reading, English, and/or Math to be remediated before taking college level courses in these subjects. HSU offers the following courses to fulfill this requirement. RDG 0043 Acad. Reading ENG 0423 Basic English MTH 0003\*Elem. Algebra (if ACT is below 17 in Math) MTH 0013 Intern. Algebra (if ACT of 17 and 18, and recommended for ACT below 20 in Math) \*MTH 0003 is sufficient remediation for students wishing to take Math for the Liberal Arts and Math Through Practical Appl. Those required to take College Algebra must complete Intermediate Algebra.

Remedial hrs. DO NOT count toward graduation.

Students may count no more than 7 hours of "D" in the Liberal Arts Core. Students must earn grades of "C" or better in Freshman English A & B. Grades of "C" or better are also required in courses used to meet the Writing Across The Curriculum requirements.

Students must earn a min. of 42 junior/senior hours in order to graduate. Most of these courses will be taken in the student's chosen major, however, any upper level course approved in the Liberal Arts Core will also count towards this requirement. Foreign language at the intermediate level may count as upper level if taken during the junior or senior year. Students with a score of 25 or higher on the English and Reading sections of the ACT (or equivalent test) will be awarded credit for ENG 1463 (Freshman English A) after completion of 15 hours at Henderson with a 2.00 or higher grade point average and ENG 1473 (Freshman English B) with a grade of "C" or better.

**Transfer Students:** Audit required for gen. ed. deficiencies – contact Cris McGough

**Correspondence Hours:** 30 hrs max (12 consecutive hrs. max).

**Application for Graduation:** must be made after 80 hrs and at least 1 semester before graduation. Meet with your advisor with an application form from registrar and a current transcript.

**Remediation Courses** don't count toward graduation hours. All remedial work must be done before jr/sr courses. Math must be taken sequentially. CLEP tests at Henderson Testing Center (\$80+) Eng A & B must clep together. Scores are not transferred in but must be submitted.

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
