## HONORS GUIDELINES

Most entering honors-eligible students sign up for ENG 1803, English Honors (Substitutes for English B; must have ACT sub-scores of at least 25 in both English and Reading.)

Students who have satisfied the English B requirement should register for ENG 2793, Masters of Western Lit/Honors. [Students without AP Literature/Composition test score should sign up for English/Honors at a time matching Masters of Western Lit/Honors.]

Honors students should NOT take Philosophy, Civilization since 1660, Gen. Psychology, or Humanities Art, Music, Theatre in the first semester EXCEPT for those with 26 composite \& who do not have 25 ACT in both Eng \& Rdg.
