Job Description: Assistant/Associate Professor Educational Leadership, nine-month tenure-track position beginning August 2019. The successful applicant will teach synchronous online courses offered as part of nationally recognized programs in educational leadership. The work load will primarily include teaching graduate courses in research methods and guiding student research, including the defense process. Additional duties include but are not limited to advanced leadership course development and program coordination in collaboration with department chair. Academic advising, research, university service, scholarship, and other duties as assigned by the department chair are also included.

Qualifications: Henderson State University is an Equal Opportunity/Affirmative Action Employer with a significant commitment to the achievement of excellence and diversity among its faculty, staff, and students. In pursuit of this commitment, candidates will possess an earned doctorate in Educational Administration/Leadership or closely related field from a regionally accredited institution and at least three years higher education experience as a full-time faculty member. Public school administrative experience is desired. Applicants should demonstrate a comprehensive understanding of educational research methods and the roles and duties of an educational leader. The ideal candidate will have higher education online teaching experience, published research on educational leadership, and experience in guiding student research. Experience leading research committees is preferred. Strong interpersonal skills as well as excellent organizational and communication skills are expected along with a commitment to online instruction using synchronous technologies.

Salary: Commensurate with qualifications and experience.
