Job Description: Assistant Professor of Educational Leadership, nine-month visiting professor position beginning August 2021. The successful applicant will teach synchronous online courses offered as part of nationally recognized programs in educational leadership. The teaching load will include graduate courses in research methods and finance. Additional duties include but are not limited to academic advising, research, university service, collaboration, scholarship, and other duties as assigned by the department chair and as required in the Educational Leadership program.

In pursuit of this commitment, candidates will possess an earned doctorate in Educational Administration or related field from a regionally accredited institution. The ideal candidate will have higher education online teaching experience and experience in guiding student research. Strong interpersonal skills, as well as excellent organizational and communication skills, are expected along with a commitment to the use of technology and online instruction using synchronous technologies. The ability to plan and deliver effective online instruction and work effectively as an advisor is anticipated.
